<p><b>Explain why you think it is important and should be preserved.</b> The cottage and its small yard area to the road retains its original details (windows circa late 18<sup>th</sup> century; ground floor ones are particularly interesting in design and method of opening), plus it plays an important role in creating the setting of the original layout to this part of the village.</p> <p>The cottage is shown on the 1843Whitchurch Parish Deed Map.</p>
<p><b>Historical connection:</b> Do you know whether the buildings/structure has an historical connection with the town; i.e. was formerly an important building/structure, was connected with a prominent local person, etc. It is believed to have been the home of the schoolmaster and was shown as such on the 19<sup>th</sup> century census.</p>
