

Its green space connects to the old railway line which provides a railway corridor. The land is steeper than the parts of the estate that have been developed around it – it is a hollow. This hollow has mature trees and a wild flora.</p>

	<p>Does it enhance the feeling of tranquillity within the local area through a feeling of remoteness?</p> <p><i>Please provide justification below</i></p> <p><i>Reinforcing what was said above, the natral vegetation provides an un-manicured green space, associated with developing a sense of wildness but within the context of a housing estate.</i></p>	Y
	<p>Does it provide an area of tranquillity within a busy setting by hiding man-made structures such as roads, power-lines or lighting and by reducing the appearance of noise and light impacts?</p> <p><i>Please provide justification below</i></p>	N

It contains mature trees, long grass and scrub. The gully/hollow will also be damp and shaded. This area significantly contributes to the biodiversity of the area.</p>	Y

Are there ancient hedgerows, woodland, veteran trees on the site?</p> <p><i>If yes, please provide details below</i></p> <p>As described above, this area (a hollow) has been left untouched in the development and supports mature trees, shrubs, scrub and grasses and provides shaded and damp habitat. It also connects to a railway corridor (extending and linking up with it) that has been identified in the Nature Recovery Network and therefore supporting the size and connectivity available for wildlife.</p>	Y

	<p><i>If yes, please provide details below</i></p> <p><i>As a wild space, it is difficult, without a survey or residents opinions, to evidence support. Unlike play areas, in which infrastructure is in itself evidence of activity, this is not so possible with wild areas.</i></p>	N

	<p><i>If yes, please provide details below:</i></p> <p>This wooded hollow supports vegetation with much greater carbon storage than managed grass. It also provides shading and the 'rough' vegetation holds and slows water and therefore is useful in relation to flood mitigation.</p>	Y
